Dr. DuVall received MPH and MD degrees from Case Western Reserve University. He then completed an internal medicine and pediatrics residency at the University of Michigan, followed by a medical oncology fellowship at Oregon Health & Science University and a pediatric hematology/oncology fellowship at the affiliated Doernbecher Children's Hospital. As one of less than ten people who have completed training in both adult and pediatric oncology, Dr. DuVall specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of cancer for adolescents and young adults (AYAs), with an emphasis on the treatment of acute leukemias and aggressive lymphomas, and the psychosocial care of all AYAs with cancer. As part of UChicago Medicine's Adolescent and Young Adult Oncology Program, he provides comprehensive cancer care for AYAs through collaboration with an amazing multi-disciplinary team. Dr. DuVall's research explores the adaptation of new treatments and therapies into bedside care and the extension of novel therapies to the forefront of the treatment of leukemia and lymphoma. He leads multiple studies aiming to incorporate patient reported outcome and health related quality of life measures into prospective clinical trials with the goal of amplifying the patient voice in research. Partnering with this, he is active in research aimed at decreasing the impact of cancer therapy on the psychosocial development and outcomes of AYA patients. He hopes to combine these areas to improve patients quality of life through specific interventions where they are needed most.
